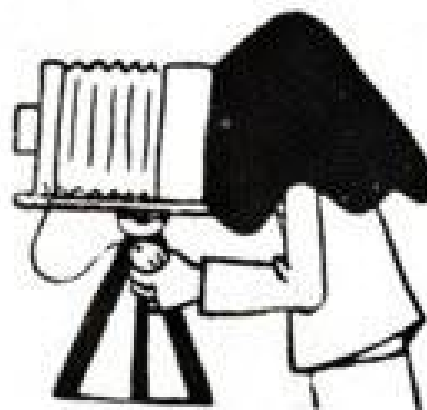

THIS ISSUE'S PHOTO-QUIZ: What do you think composes the ingredients of a career serviceman?

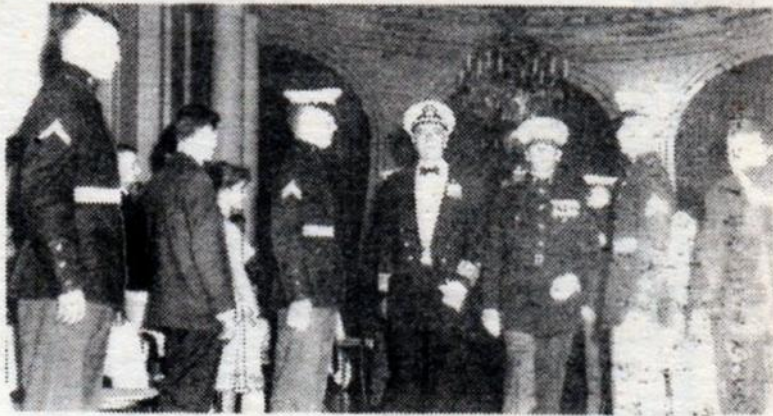

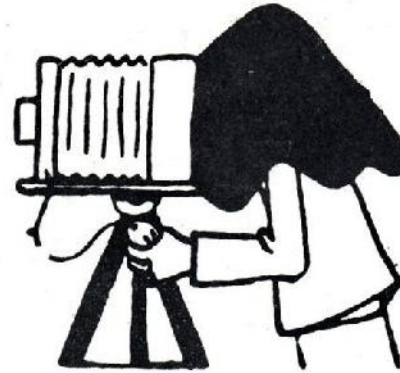
